Major trends in data in different sectors in Senegal (1)

- Institutional change made 10 years ago → more power and resources to ANSD and reinforcement of the NSS capacities.
- Consequently, improvements noted in data quality, availability, accessibility and usability (e.g. progress in sectors such as education and health)

Major trends in data in different sectors in Senegal (2)

- Improvements due to improved capacities in terms of :
 - ✓ Infrastructure/ENSAE creation, new building for ANSD
 - ✓ Human resources (quality and quantity)
 - ✓ Role of technology (PDAs, tablets PC for conducting surveys and census)

Major trends in data in different sectors in Senegal (3)

- Lack of completeness of data for some sectors, despite the significant improvements
- The main sectors concerned are Environment, Culture, Justice and Sport
- Environment is the more challenging and problematic Post-MDG in terms of data availability, quality, accessibility and usability according to the data quality assessment framework results

Major trends in data in different sectors in Senegal (4)

- Problem of divergence in data produced by MEDD (environment) departments for monitoring indicators (data available for 1 of 5 indicators)
- Lack of disaggregated data for the majority of sectors and at the local level, despite the context of decentralization
- Improve data adequacy: Efforts need to be made for streamlining sector ministries/centralization of management of human resources under the control of ANSD

Feasibility of selected “zero” or “minimum standard” targets

- Feasibility of some of the global minimum standard targets with the implementation of the PSE
- PSE is the flagship policy document with policy objectives to ensure economic emergence by 2035
- Possible to have zero poor by 2030 under PSE conditions (or if it’s business as usual it will be possible in 2040)
