Background

Current geopolitical developments with policy shifts such as reduced official development assistance (ODA) can hinder actions to accelerate SDG achievements. Approaching 2030, the UN in 2024 stated that only 17% of the SDG targets are currently on track, with nearly half showing minimal or moderate progress, and over one-third stalled or regressing due to various factors such as COVID-19 and geopolitical tensions. The reversal of progress toward achieving the SDGs, among a deepening global crisis, is exacerbating inequalities at an unprecedented scale. Moreover, the declining ODA is pressing for the Global South as think tanks in the region also require external funding that frequently comes from ODA to carry out research or programs aiming to promote sustainable development. These circumstances have underscored the urgent need to reimagine the development agenda, the role of the Global South, and the leadership of Southern actors amid emerging and complex challenges.

Purpose

The virtual event will serve three key purposes: first, to launch the Global South Perspectives publication, second, to explore the role of think tanks amid pressing geopolitical developments and policy shifts, such as reductions in official development assistance and the equity backlash, and third, to kickstart Southern Voice Talks (SV Talks), a series of conversations led by the Global South to discuss strategic issues and influence global debate. This will be an opportunity to discuss how Global South think tanks can navigate these challenges and identify opportunities to thrive in the current circumstances.

Event Description

The launch of the Global South Perspectives (GSP) publication will be at the core of this 75-minute virtual event. This new publication brings together unique insights and actionable recommendations from across the Global South highlighting urgent global challenges—including the climate crisis, debt burdens, and other critical governance issues.

To mark its release, the launch event will open a timely and forward-looking discussion on how think tanks in the Global South are navigating complex geopolitical shifts, and shrinking official development assistance. Issues that directly affect the influence, sustainability, and role of Global South actors in shaping global governance.

The conversation will serve as a platform to launch the **Global South Perspectives (GSP)** publication and to emphasise the urgent need for Global South unity and cooperation in navigating these rapid changes through high quality, evidence-based research. This event will also kickstart Southern Voice Talks, a series of monthly discussions throughout the year that will delve deeper into the ideas and voices featured in the publication.
